Abstract		• Explains how the study was conducted, including participants, instruments, and procedures.
Introduction		• Summarizes the final takeaways, implications, and limitations of the study.
Methodology		• A summary of the study, showing the main purpose, methods, and findings.
Results		• Visual aids used to organize and display numerical data or data summaries clearly.
Discussion		• Provides the background, rationale, and the specific objectives or research questions.
Conclusion		• Presents the data and statistical or qualitative findings obtained from the research.
References		• Interprets the findings, explains what the results mean, and compares them with other studies.
Tables / Figures		• Lists all the academic sources and authors cited throughout the paper.
