For this reason, we sometimes require translating into other languages that can help communicate between people who speak different languages. In an easy way using language translation software makes translating from any applications on your mobile phone.



How to use Google Translate Mobile Application

First, download “Google Translate” on the App Store or Play Store.



Then, open the app and choose the languages you want to translate-- for example, from Japanese to English.



Next, type or paste your text into the white box. You can also import text images for translation from the photo library on your mobile phone into the white box.



Finally, the translated text will appear automatically. If it doesn't, click the blue arrow.
