The Two Sides of Teen Technology Use

Modern technology has fundamentally reshaped how teenagers learn, communicate, and navigate their daily lives. Smartphones, social media platforms, and high-speed internet access allow teens to connect instantly with peers around the world, join supportive online communities, and access vast amounts of educational resources with a single tap. Digital tools have also opened up creative outlets, enabling young people to learn coding, create digital art, and share their voices globally.

However, the widespread influence of technology presents significant challenges. Excessive screen time and continuous exposure to social media notifications can lead to sleep deprivation, reduced physical activity, and decreased attention spans in school. Furthermore, constant comparisons to curated online profiles often contribute to heightened anxiety, low self-esteem, and a fear of missing out (FOMO). To build a healthy relationship with technology, experts recommend setting boundaries, such as scheduling screen-free hours and practicing digital literacy to critically evaluate online content.
