

There was... and There were...

Rule	Noun	Example
There was... (same as is)	Singular	There was <u>a cat</u> on the sofa <u>yesterday</u> .
	Uncountable	There was <u>some milk</u> in the glass <u>last night</u> .
There were... (same as are)	Plural	There were <u>three dogs</u> in the park <u>two days ago</u> .

5. There (was / were) an apple on the desk this morning.
6. Five minutes ago, there (was / were) some cars in front of the school.
7. There (was / were) some milk in the glass an hour ago.
