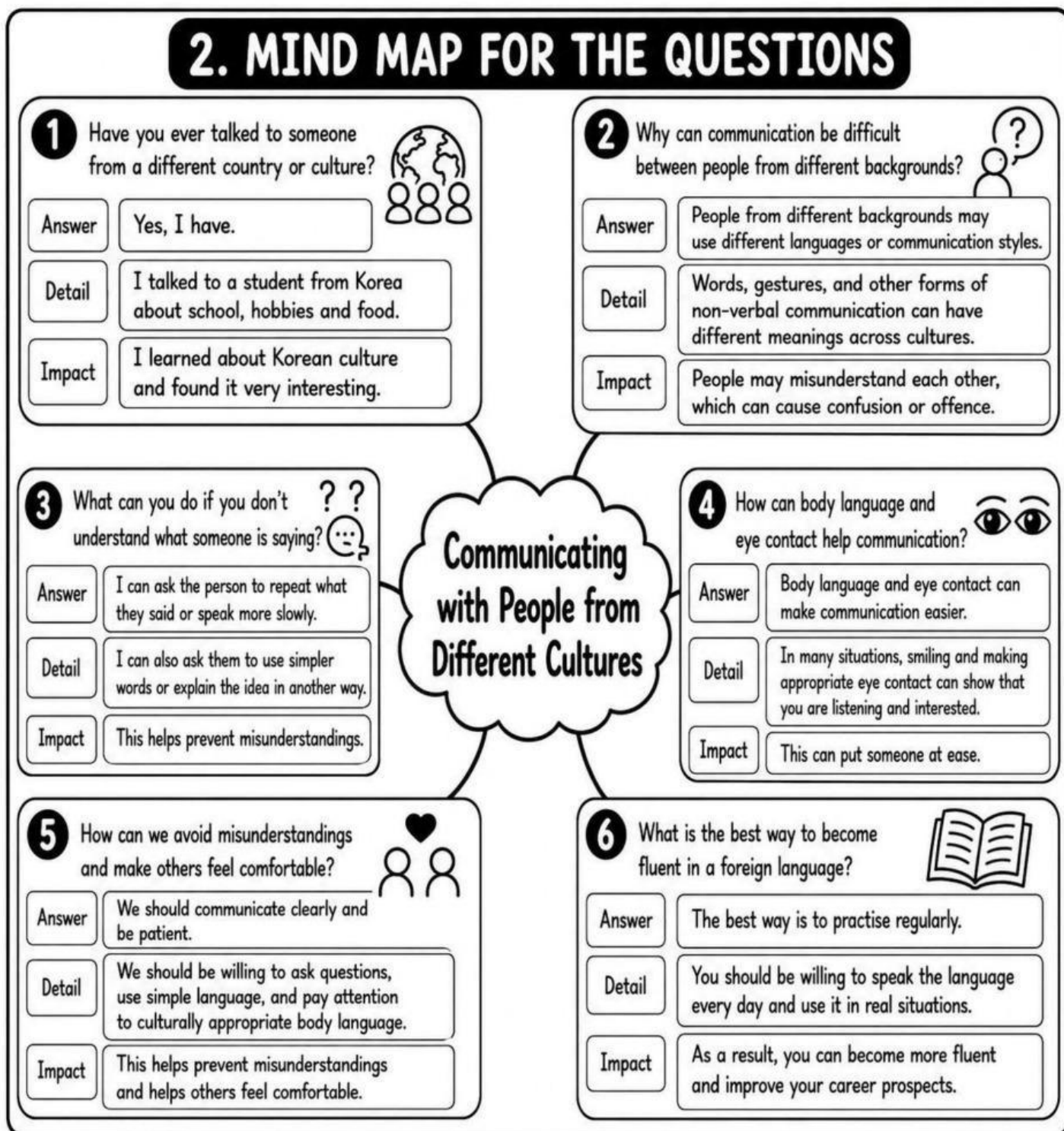

Vera Neumann was a designer and businesswoman whose products found their way into the homes of people across the USA.
