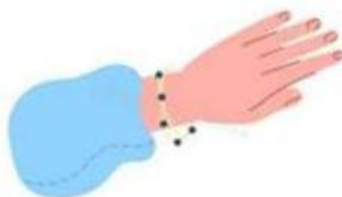

A Trip to Remember

Every year, Mrs Tan's class picks a place to go for their school trip, and the students always look forward to it. This year, after talking about it together, everyone agreed on the city museum, because they wanted to learn how people lived a hundred years ago. The class went to the museum by train, and this was very exciting for many students who had never been on a train before. As the train left the station, the children looked out of the windows, not wanting to miss anything.

When they got to the museum, a friendly guide showed the students old photos, old letters, and even old toys that children used to play with long ago. The students were surprised to learn that children in the past did not have phones or computers, but they still found fun ways to play, like making up games with sticks and stones. The guide said that these simple things were very special to the families who once owned them. Some students said they had never thought about how different life was without modern technology, and a few started to feel thankful for what they have.

Halfway through the tour, the class stopped in a quiet room full of old black-and-white photos. The guide talked about how hard life was in the past, with long working hours and not many things to use, but also how strong and clever people were to get through it. This part of the tour made many students think about how easy and comfortable their own lives are now.

After the tour, the students had a picnic lunch in the museum's peaceful garden, where they talked happily about what they had seen. Some students said the trip was much more interesting than they thought it would be, because they could really imagine what life was like before modern technology. Others said they felt thankful for the things they usually take for granted. Before getting on the train to go home, Mrs Tan gathered the class together and told them that even small, everyday things can tell a big story about the past, and that history is not only in textbooks, but also in the ordinary things people leave behind.

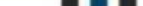
