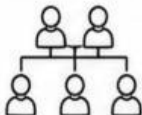

Answer

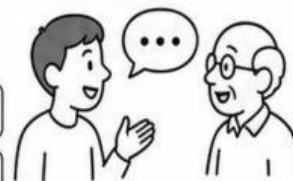
Different generations can catch up by spending time together and asking questions.
