 4. Our children have never eaten pizzas, burgers, chips, candy, or any junk food because they don't see any commercials for it. Also, we have more time to cook, so we try new healthy recipes together.
 5. I think we might be a little smarter now, too. Some studies have shown that watching TV can change the way your brain works. Kids who watch a lot of TV when they're very young often start speaking later.
