Recuerda:

AT se utiliza para momentos concretos en el tiempo: *at 5pm, at this moment, at that time*. Ten cuidado, porque esto incluye periodos más largos, aunque siguen siendo concretos: *at Christmas time*.

ON se utiliza con días: *on Thursday, on July 4th, on Halloween*.

IN se utiliza con períodos de tiempo más largos (meses, estaciones, años, etc.): *in June, in 2019, in summer, in the Jurassic Period*. **IN** también se utiliza para referirse a un tiempo delimitado, es decir, con un punto de inicio y otro de final: *in a week, in 2-3 days*.
