

SCHOOLS IN BRITAIN - NOT ONLY LESSONS



1 What are after-school clubs?

All schools have after-school clubs. They offer students a **choice** of interesting activities, from dancing and chess to judo, cooking and sports. There are also clubs to help students with their homework. Sometimes students take extra Math classes or they have French, Spanish or German conversation classes. Teachers usually **encourage** their students to go to these clubs. Students enjoy after-school clubs and they learn a lot of new things.

School trips are an important part of school life, too. Teachers take their students on day trips to museums, art galleries and other places of interest, like Stonehenge or the Roman baths in Bath. Sometimes they go to theatres and concerts, too. There are also trips to visit interesting cities in the UK, like Oxford or Stratford-Upon-Avon. Schools sometimes organize sports trips, too, like skiing in France or Italy, and adventure sports courses like rock-climbing or kayaking.

All secondary schools have teams for sports such as football, rugby, netball and hockey in winter and tennis, cricket and athletics in the summer. There are usually training sessions at lunchtimes and after school. The school teams play competitive matches against other schools in a **league**.

Some students have music lessons to learn to play an instrument at school. Schools often have an orchestra and a **choir**, and there are sometimes rock, jazz and folk bands, too. School orchestras



and choirs have **rehearsals** at lunchtime and after school and give concerts during the year. In December, music teachers usually organize a Christmas concert.

The school theatre production is another important part of school life. Schools usually have one theatre production a year, often a **play** by Shakespeare like *Hamlet* or *Romeo and Juliet*. Musicals like *The Lion King* and *Mamma Mia* are also popular - the school orchestra plays the music and students sing, dance and act. The performances are usually in the evening and students' families and friends come to watch them.
