Sap vacuole	Contains cell sap and helps keep the plant cell firm.
Cell membrane	Controls what enters and leaves the cell.
Cell wall	A strong cellulose layer that supports the cell and gives it a regular shape.
Cytoplasm	Jelly-like material where many chemical reactions happen.

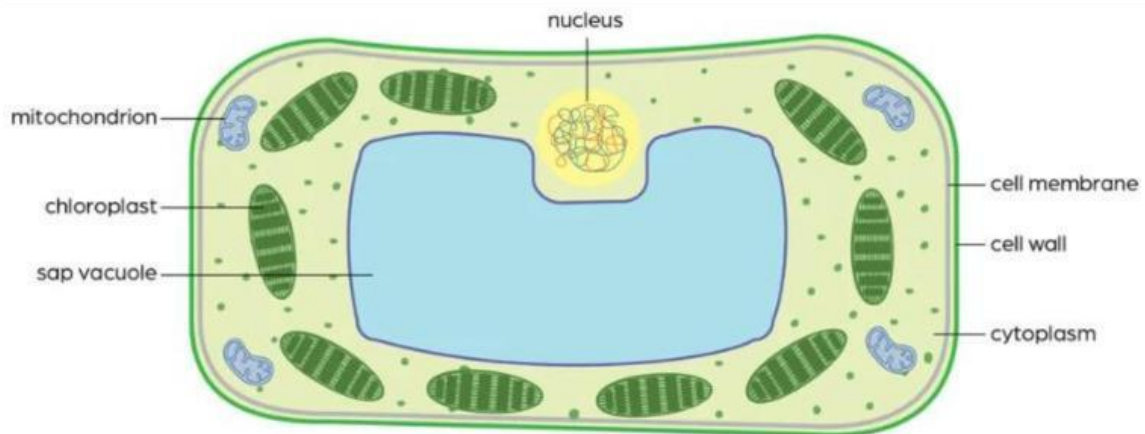


Figure 3.9 Parts of a plant cell

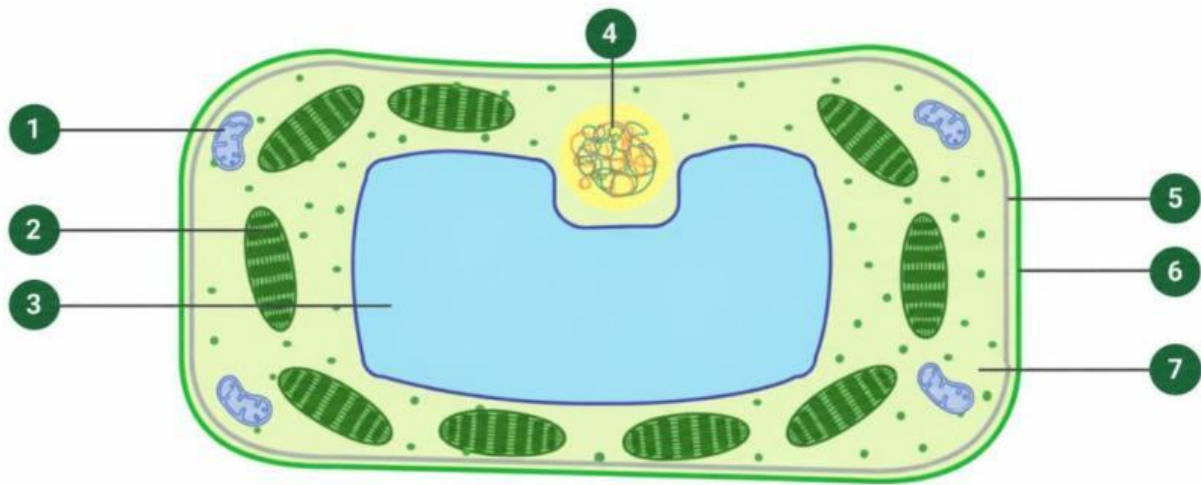

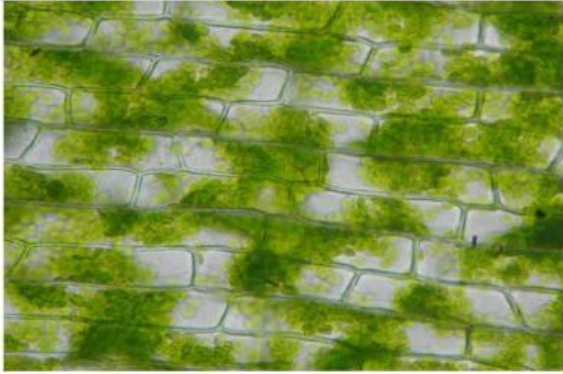

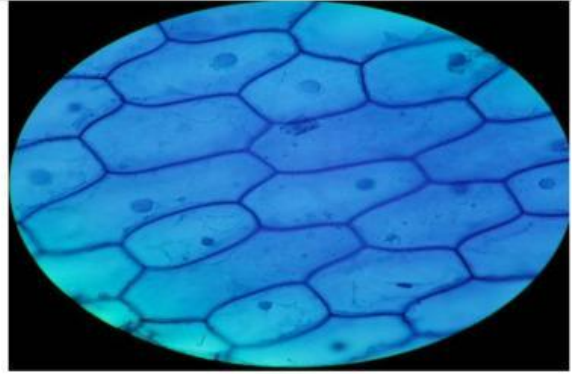
The Mystery of the Missing Chloroplasts
