Demonstrative Adjectives help us show which people or things we mean.

This and That
are for **singular** nouns
(one person or thing).

These and Those
are for **plural** nouns
(more than one person or thing).

This

We use **this** for a singular noun that is near us (close).



This is my book.



This is my dog.

That

We use **that** for a singular noun that is far from us (not close).



That is a car.



That is a cat.

These

We use **these** for plural nouns that are near us (close).



These are my books.



These are pencils.

Those

We use **those** for plural nouns that are far from us (not close).



Those are trees.



Those are chairs.

Remember!

- ★ **This** = one thing, near
- ★ **That** = one thing, far
- ★ **These** = more than one thing, near
- ★ **Those** = more than one thing, far
