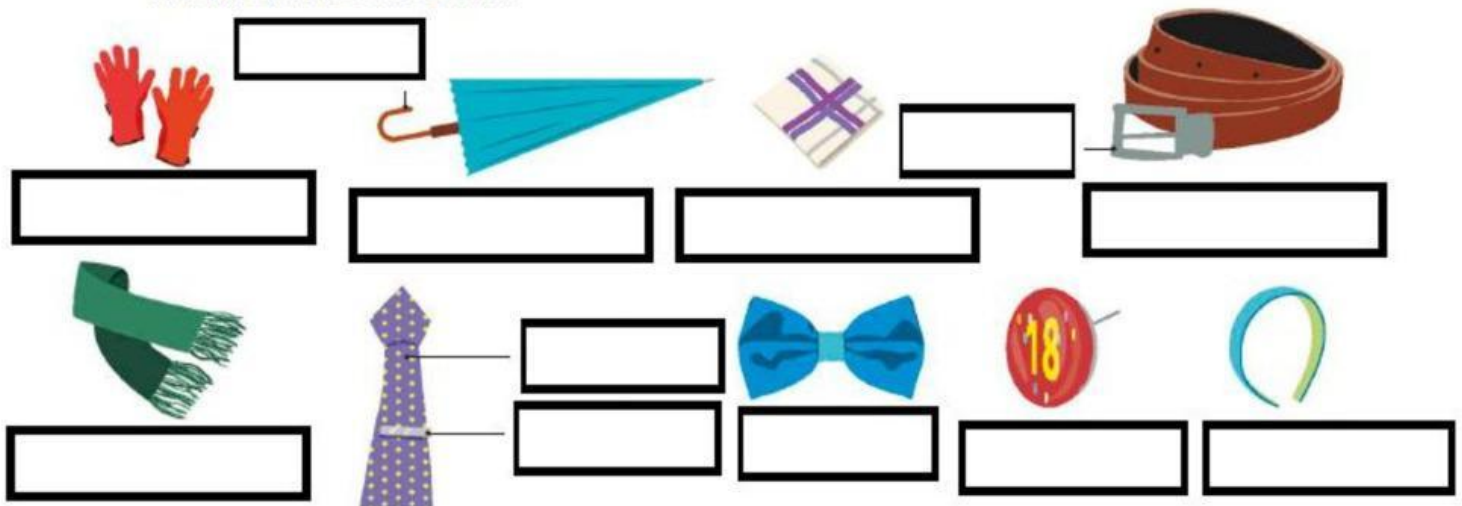

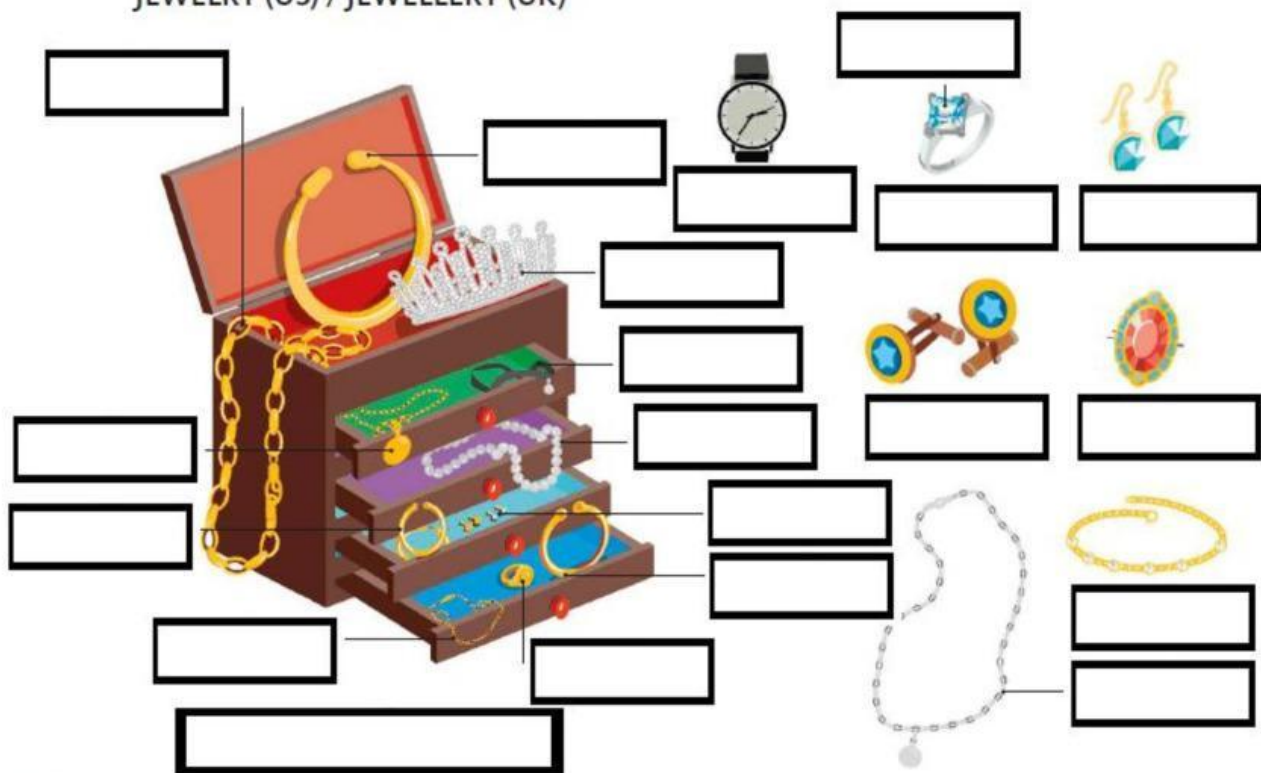

She doesn't want to take too many things with her.

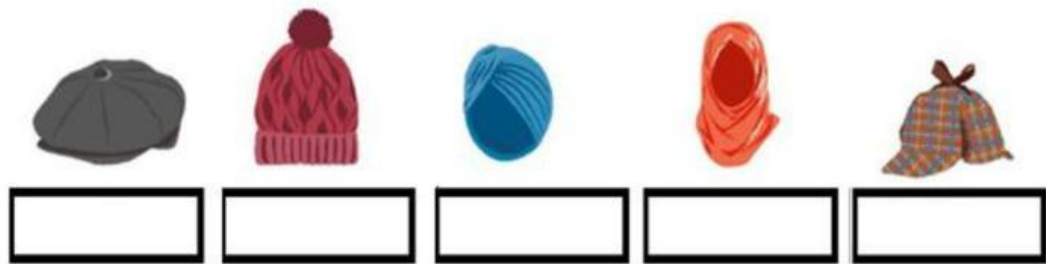
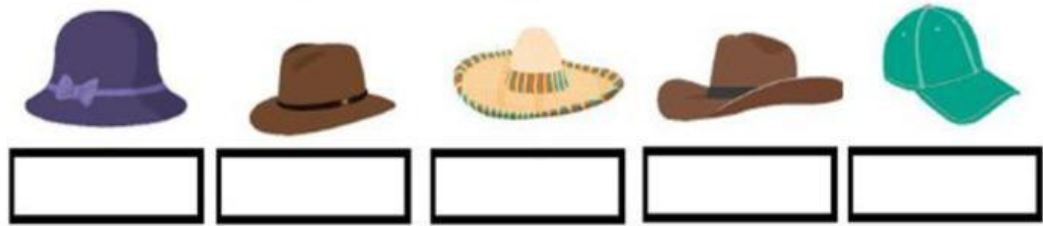
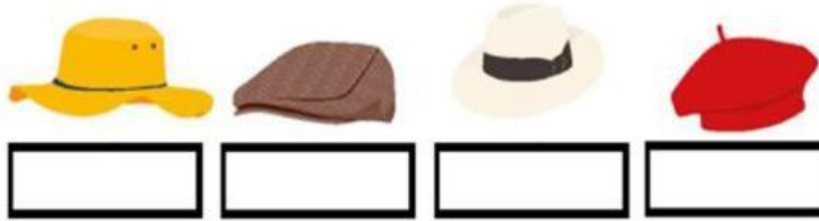
