

*He **is exploring** a graph right now.*
- expressar mudanças que ocorrem momentaneamente (tendências atuais).
*"English **is becoming** the language of the technology age."*
*Many people **are using** English on the Internet nowadays.*

Veja, no quadro a seguir, as regras ortográficas para verbos terminados em -ing.

Regras ortográficas para verbos terminados em -ing	Exemplos
A maioria dos verbos: verbo + ing	do + ing → <input type="text"/> talk + ing → <input type="text"/>
Verbos terminados em e: verbo - e + ing	use - e + ing → <input type="text"/> become - e + ing → <input type="text"/>
Verbos terminados em consoante + vogal + consoante: verbo + última consoante + ing	stop + p + ing → <input type="text"/> swim + m + ing → <input type="text"/>
Verbos terminados em ie: verbo - ie + y + ing	die - ie + ing → <input type="text"/> lie - ie + ing → <input type="text"/>
