8. Having taken a new job, my aunt Will be traveling Brazil for a month.
9. After milking the cows, the farmer's Wife began to feed the chickens.

Read each sentence. Then, rewrite each sentence to change the verb in the subordinate clause to the tense indicated in parentheses.

EXAMPLE: I hope that he votes for me. (present progressive)

ANSWER: I hope that he is voting for me.

1. I believe that Tim left. (past progressive)
2. Marissa knows that her brother left for school. (future progressive)
3. Kelly hopes that her friend finishes her homework. (present perfect).
4. I see that Malik is waiting for his ride. (present perfect progressive)
5. Do you know that Kordell has been studying French? (past emphatic)
