make you the perfect candidate.

Oh, and feel free to pause and read when you need to.

I've only got so long. Where was I? Right!

Make \_\_\_\_\_ [27] between your previous \_\_\_\_\_ . [28]

Employers will likely have read your \_\_\_\_\_ [29] already,

You can also make any clarifications--
