

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

(Regular Verbs)

POSITIVE SENTENCES

1. CHANGE THE FOLLOWING SENTENCES TO SIMPLE PAST TENSE.

Example: He pulls teeth. He **pulled** teeth.

I turn on the radio. I **turned** on the radio.

1. I clean my room.
2. I listen to the radio.
3. We change our clothes.

NEGATIVE SENTENCES

2. MAKE THE SENTENCE NEGATIVE IN THE SIMPLE PAST TENSE FORM AS IN THE EXAMPLE

Example: he-buy a car-a bicycle He **didn't buy** a bicycle.

QUESTION and ANSWER
