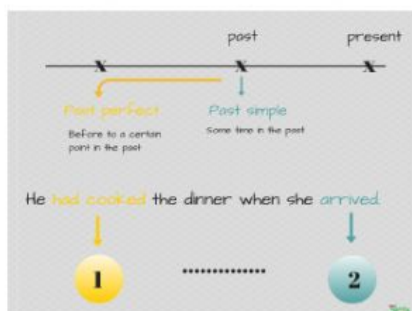


PAST PERFECT OR SIMPLE PAST?

Form: **had** + **past participle**
