	Indigenous Peoples of Canada	
	There are three groups of Indigenous People in Canada: First Nations, Inuit and the Metis. Indigenous Canadians are an estimated 7% of the population of Canada. In the past, they had a very different economy, government and spirituality than the Europeans. Some hunted for <b>caribou</b> , <b>bison</b> and <b>seal</b> . Some gathered berries and nuts from the forests. Some grew <b>corn</b> , beans and <b>squash</b> . They made clothing from animal skins and weapons from animal bones. They lived in <b>igloos</b> , <b>teepees</b> or <b>longhouses</b> . Indigenous Peoples lived in family groups; some large and some small. Some bands, groups of Indigenous Peoples, had equal and democratic systems of government. Their spiritual beliefs focused on the environment and the animals on which they depended.
