These factories were not very safe. , the working conditions were very poor, and they had to work long hours. At this time trade unions were developing. These groups worked to protect the rights of all workers.
Women also joined these protests. The Social Political Party formed a women's national committee. This group called for the party to give one day each year to women. In 1908, 15,000 women in New York went on strike because of low pay and terrible conditions in the factories where they worked.
Other women fought for a right to vote
The United Nations declared 8 March International Women's Day in 1975. Since then, IWD has become a global event that is supported by charities, institutions, companies, and governmental organizations. A lot of special events take place around the world. There are exhibitions, shows, talks, discussions, tours, films, workshops, and much more. Overall, the events are designed to celebrate the role of women in society and to take a moment to appreciate all that has been done to increase equality between men and women.
Although women are becoming more powerful in business, entertainment, politics and many more areas, there are still a lot of inequalities around the world which call for mobilization to grant women the status they should have.
