WHEN APPROACHING TO PASS

- 1) BEFORE YOU PASS, LOOK _____ FOR ROAD CONDITIONS AND TRAFFIC THAT MAY CAUSE OTHER VEHICLES TO MOVE INTO YOUR LANE.
- 2) ONLY PASS WHEN _____ TO DO SO.
- 3) YOU MUST _____ WHETHER YOU HAVE ENOUGH ROOM TO PASS WHENEVER YOU APPROACH:

DO NOT PASS:

- IF YOU ARE _____ A HILL OR CURVE AND CANNOT SEE IF OTHER TRAFFIC IS APPROACHING.
- WITHIN 100 FEET OF AN INTERSECTION, BRIDGE, TUNNEL, RAILROAD CROSSING, OR AREAS THAT COULD CAUSE _____.

HOW TO PASS:

- 1) NEVER DRIVE OFF THE PAVED OR MAIN-TRAVELED _____ OF THE ROAD OR ON THE SHOULDER TO PASS.
- 2) THE EDGE OF THE MAIN-TRAVELED PORTION OF THE ROAD MAY HAVE A PAINTED WHITE LINE ON THE ROAD'S _____.
- 3) PASSING OTHER VEHICLES AT _____, RAILROAD CROSSINGS, AND DRIVEWAYS IS DANGEROUS.
- 4) PASS _____ ON THE LEFT.
- 5) YOU MAY PASS ON THE RIGHT WHEN:
 - AN OPEN HIGHWAY IS _____ MARKED FOR 2 OR MORE LANES OF TRAVEL IN YOUR DIRECTION.

- THE DRIVER AHEAD OF YOU IS TURNING LEFT AND YOU DO NOT DRIVE OFF THE _____ TO PASS. NEVER PASS ON THE LEFT IF THE DRIVER IS SIGNALING A LEFT TURN.
 - ON A ONE-WAY _____.
- 6) ALWAYS _____ BEFORE PASSING.
 - 7) YOU MAY ALSO LIGHTLY TAP YOUR HORN, OR BRIEFLY FLASH YOUR LIGHTS, TO LET THE OTHER DRIVER KNOW YOU _____ TO PASS.
 - 8) DO NOT PULL OUT TO PASS UNLESS YOU KNOW YOU HAVE ENOUGH _____ TO PULL BACK INTO YOUR LANE.
 - 9) AVOID PASSING OTHER VEHICLES, INCLUDING _____ AND BICYCLES, ON TWO LANE ROADS.
 - 10) WHEN YOU PASS A BICYCLIST, SLOW DOWN AND PASS THE BICYCLIST ONLY WHEN SAFE, ALLOWING A _____ OF 3 FEET BETWEEN YOUR VEHICLE AND THE BICYCLIST WHERE POSSIBLE.
 - 11) DO NOT _____ THE BICYCLIST OFF THE ROAD.
