

Indefinite pronouns

Indefinite pronouns

Pronouns ending in **-one** or **-body** are used to refer to people.

Example

Everyone is ready to go.

Pronouns ending in **-thing** are used to refer to things.

Example

Everything had gone silent.

Pronouns ending in **-where** are used to refer to places that you do not know.

Example

I've looked **everywhere** for it.
