

Anne Frank

Anne Frank is the most famous Jewish victim of the Nazi Holocaust of World War II. She was born on June 12, 1929.

Anne's parents gave a diary as a present in her 13th birthday. In this one she wrote all the events of her life from 1942 to 1944.

During this time, Anne spent two years in hiding with her family in Nazi-occupied Amsterdam in a secret part of a house with four other Jews.

Betrayed and discovered in 1944, Anne was sent to the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp, where she died of typhus in 1945.

Anne's father, Otto Frank, was the only one who survived the war. In 1947, he published Anne's diary as "The Diary of a Young Girl."

Anne's thoughts about the kindness of people have become one of the world's most widely read books.
