1. Direct and indirect speech

DIRECT SPEECH	INDIRECT or REPORTED SPEECH
Exact words spoken. Example: 'There's a fly in my soup', he said	When we tell someone about a previous conversation.  Example: He said there was a fly in <b>his</b> soup
