

Discover the origins of New Zealand and crack the code...



New Zealand was discovered in 1642 by a Dutch explorer named Abel Tasman. In 1645, Dutch cartographers renamed the land Nova Zeelandia after the Dutch province of Zeeland. British explorer James Cook then anglicised the name to New Zealand.

The current Māori name for New Zealand is Aotearoa (pronounced /autəˈrou.ə/; it means "the land of the long white cloud").

New Zealand has two main islands; Māori had several traditional names for them: Te Ika-a-Māui (the fish of Māui) for the North Island and Te Waipounamu (the waters of greenstone) or Te Waka o Aoraki (the canoe of Aoraki) for the South Island.
