

Suzanne Collins's best seller

The American television writer and novelist Suzanne Collins was born on August 10, 1962 in Connecticut (USA). Collins' career began in 1991 as a writer for children's television shows. She worked on several television shows for Nickelodeon but she became famous worldwide for *The Hunger Games* trilogy: the novels are set in a dystopian future, where the totalitarian nation of Panem is divided into 12 districts and the Capitol. Each year two young representatives from each district are selected by lottery to participate in The Hunger Games. Part entertainment, part brutal retribution for a past rebellion, the televised games are broadcast throughout Panem. The 24 participants are forced to eliminate their competitors while the citizens of the Capitol watch the show. The 16-year-old Katniss is selected as District 12's female representative, together with her male counterpart, Peeta and they are forced to fight against bigger, stronger representatives, some of whom have trained for this their whole lives.

Getting around New York



Buses

There are 4,300 buses on over 200 routes in New York. Bus stops are at street corners about every two blocks. Signposts are marked with a bus emblem and route number. Most buses operate between 5 am and 2 am, while certain buses run 24 hours a day. Schedule and maps are posted at stops. Double-decker buses offer unlimited hop-on and hop-off opportunities to explore the city.

Trains

There are 24 subway lines serving 468 stations. Stops are clearly posted and subway maps are on view at stations and in every car. Whatever the distance, the bus and the subway fare is 2 dollars payable by the Metro Card, a prepaid pass that includes free transfers between buses and subways, or by exact change on buses. You can buy your Metro Card at many hotels, subway stations, vending machines, train terminals and 3,500 stores throughout New York.

Taxicabs

Taxi stands are located at all major Manhattan transportation terminals. When hailing a cab, you simply stand on a corner close enough to the street to be seen by the drivers, and raise your hand.

Limousine service

White limousines equipped with free bar, television, DVD player and stereo are offered at taxi prices. Limousine Service provides safe and elegant transportation at affordable rates.

Boats

You can cruise the three rivers on a boat, water taxi, ferry, catamaran, or yacht. You can have 90-minute, 2-hour or full-day cruises. Thanks to daily departures from 10 am to 3 pm, millions of visitors can discover the secrets of the city.

Helicopters

You can also have helicopter tours from 9 am to 7 pm. Helicopter flight services offer 20-minute tours of NY from three convenient locations: VIP Heliport, Downtown Heliport (East River) and Paulus Hook Helistop (New Jersey).
