







GRAMMAR WORKSHEET

POSSESSIVE: -'S and -S'

<p>singular nouns: add -'s</p> <p>example: boy → boy's</p> 	<p>The boy's bicycle is blue.</p> 
<p>plural nouns: add -s'</p> <p>example: boys → boys'</p> 	<p>The boys' bicycles are blue.</p> 
<p>some irregular plural nouns: add -'s</p> <p>example: children → children's</p> 	<p>The children's bicycles are blue.</p> 

Example:

The children have a ball. The ball is lost. ⇒ The children's ball is lost.
