

QUANTIFIERS

1- READ THE CHART

Grammar	Quantifiers
Countable nouns	Uncountable nouns
We learn a lot of / lots of songs.	I've got a lot of / lots of money.
How many bracelets are you wearing?	How much luggage has she got?
There aren't many markets near here.	We haven't got much furniture.
We've got some DVDs.	I've got some orange juice.
I haven't got any bracelets.	I haven't got any water.
Have you got any pictures?	Have you got any sugar?
Thanks for letting us take a few magazines.	I've got a little money.
There are very few people.	There's very little information.

REMEMBER:

- We use '**some**' in affirmative sentences
- We use '**any**' in negative and interrogative sentences

COUNTABLES

- A few = some
- Few = not many

UNCOUNTABLES

- A little = some
- Little + not much

2- CHOOSE THE CORRECT QUANTIFIER

1- We are going to be late. There is too **much / many** traffic.- Yeah, the amount of people driving is incredible. I've never seen so **much / many** cars.

2- Can you bring soda to the picnic? I don't have **some / any** - Yeah, I think I've got **some / any** left over from the party.

3- How do you think you did on the test? I think I did **little / a little** better than last time, maybe even **a lot / many** better. What about you?

Well, I think I probably made **few / a few** mistakes, but I have the feeling I did well tough.

4- We must be quick. We have **little / few** time. We're gonna miss the bus.

5- There were **a little / a few** people in the party. It was a bit boring, so we left early
