

Review of Conditional Forms

Reading: A year off

Tom: Do you think I should take a year off before going to college? I think that if people take a year off, they're more mature when they start school, and they get more out of it. What do you think?



Uncle: That's a good question. If I had taken a year off, I would have traveled around the world. I think it can be a very good idea if you plan properly and do something useful with it.

Tom: I know! But mom think that if I travel for a year, I won't want to go to college when I come back.

Uncle: Yes, that's a risk, but if I were you, I'd go for it. Just make sure you keep your main goal in mind and don't get distracted.

Type of Conditional	Form	Function and Examples
third	If + past perfect, would(n't) have + participle.	To talk about unreal situations in the past: "If I had known about this opportunity I would have taken it"
second	If + simple past, would(n't) + base form	To talk about things that the speaker feels are unreal or unlikely in the present or future: "If we were in the beach, I would be relaxed."
first	If + simple present, will (won't) + base form	To talk about thing that the speaker thinks are likely or possible in the future: "If you stop complaining, you will appreciate things more"

zero	If + simple present, simple present.	To talk about things that are generally true: <i>"If you rest properly, you can focus easily"</i>

The Passive

Reading: Pakistan under water

In August 2013, large areas of Pakistan were underwater as the country suffered from sever flooding yet again. The floods were caused by unusually heavy monsoon rains.

Over 200 people were killed and it's estimated that 80,000 houses and 1.5 million acres of crops were damaged or destroyed. Approximately 1.5 million people were affected in some way by the disaster.



When the 2013 flood occurred, much of the damage caused by the previous year's flooding had not yet been repaired, which increased their impact. However, several years of severe flooding had improved the response to disaster.



Since 2013, many houses, buildings and roads have been rebuilt, but the focus needs to be on reducing the risk of damage in the event of extreme weather in the future. Dams and other water channels are being advised not to build in very low lying areas or near rivers and canals. However a lack of funding remains an issue.

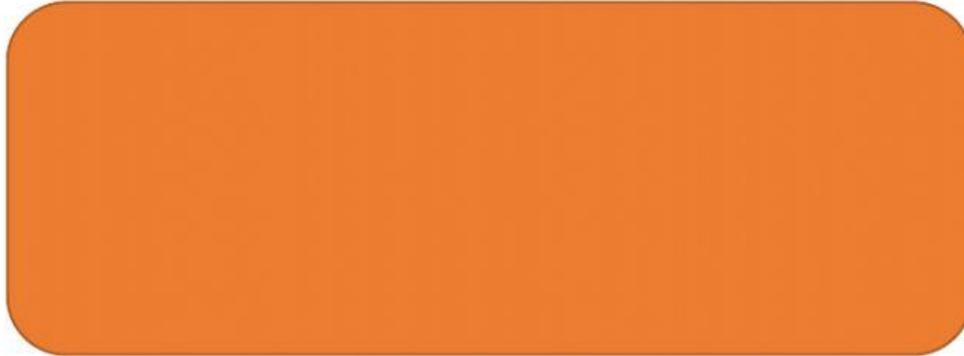
The passive is usually used when the action is more important than the person doing the action. Also when we do not know the person doing the action, or even when there's none.
