Relative pronouns ( *who*, *which*, *that* ) and adverbs ( *where* )

Remember that we use:

- '**who**' to refer to people
- '**which**' to refer to animals, things, abstract nouns
- '**that**' to refer to people, animals, things, abstract nouns → it can replace 'who' and 'which'
- '**where**' to refer to places
