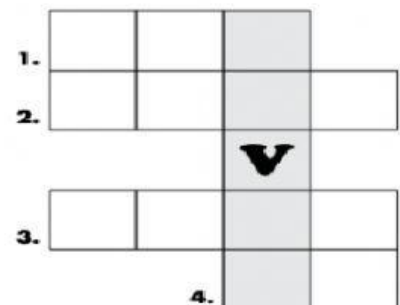

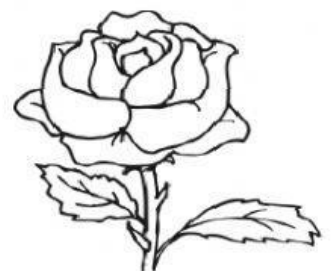

Mettle is courage. / A **metal** is a substance such as iron, copper, silver, lead, or brass.

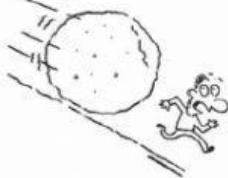
