

**Grammar**

**1 Present perfect: *already* & *yet***

I/You/ We/They	have	<b>already made</b> a cake.
He/She/It	has	
I/You/ We/They	haven't	<b>made</b> a cake <b>yet</b> .
He/She/It	hasn't	

Have	I/you/we/they	<b>made</b> a cake <b>yet</b> ?
Has	he/she/it	

Yes/No,	I/you/we/they	<b>have/haven't</b> .
	he/she/it	<b>has/hasn't</b> .

Remember that **already** is used with affirmative sentences and usually goes before the main verb.

**Yet** is used with negative sentences and questions and usually goes at the end.



**2 Present perfect: *just***

I/You/We/They	have	<b>just eaten</b> an apple.
He/She/It	has	

Have	I/you/we/they	<b>just eaten</b> an apple?
Has	he/she/it	

Yes/No,	I/you/we/they	<b>have/haven't</b> .
	he/she/it	<b>has/hasn't</b> .

We use **just** when the action has taken place very recently. We don't use **just** in negative sentences.

Remember that we use **just** when the action has happened very recently. It always goes before the main verb.
