Watersports & Diving

Scuba diving is also popular: the many shipwrecks along the coastline offer some excellent dives. The more adventurous diver can even try shark cage diving to get eye-to-eye with a great white!

It's part of a conservation area for the African penguin. You can walk around on wooden paths and watch the penguins in their natural habitat. It's great for swimming and exploring too – if you don't mind coming face-to-face with a penguin or two!

A few Facts & Figures

In summer it's about 26 °C (and remember, mid-summer here is January!) and the winter temperatures don't usually fall below 10 °C. The local currency is the rand; there are one hundred cents to every rand. The three main languages are Xhosa, English and Afrikaans. The population of Cape Town is about 3.5 million.
