

Past simple Grammar

Positive Form

I
She
HE
IT
YOU
WE
THEY

+ REGULAR VERB(ED)

EXAMPLE:

I visited **ed** my parents last week.

Spelling rules

Infinitive + ed/d	visit – visited love – loved
Vowel + y: ed	enjoy – enjoyed
Consonant + y: ied	study – studied
One-syllable verb 1 vowel + 1consonant: Double consonant + ed	stop – stopped bat – batted
Two-syllable with stress on second syllable and ending with a single consonant: Double consonant + ed	permit – permitted commit – committed

Negative form:

I
She
HE
IT
YOU
WE
THEY

+ **DIDN'T** + VERB

EXAMPLE:

She **didn't** visit her parents.

QUESTION FORM

DID
I
She
HE
IT
YOU
WE
THEY

+ VERB

EXAMPLE:

Did she visit her parents yesterday?

SHORT ANSWER:

Yes, she did.
