- MOM:** No. Cookies are bad for your teeth.
- JED:** Well, how about some ice cream?
- MOM:** No! Ice cream is bad for your teeth, too!

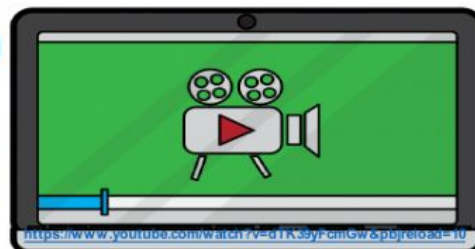

→ Os **"countable nouns"** (substantivos contáveis), tal como o nome indica, podem ser contabilizados através de números e têm forma plural.

Ex: one egg – two eggs

→ Já os **"uncountable nouns"** (substantivos incontáveis), não possuem forma plural.

Ex: the butter / some butter
