We can compare two things with comparative adjectives, and three or more things with superlative adjectives.

Cycling is **cheaper** and more **environmentally friendly** than taking the bus.

A cat is the **best** animal in the world.

It's the **best** coffee thing you can do.

Remember some adjectives have irregular comparative and superlative forms.

good - better - the best bad - worse - the worst
far - further - the furthest
