1. My brother *has had* / *had* a fight with his neighbour last week.
2. I *have often dreamt* / *often dreamt* of having a million dollars.
3. 'Do you know Canada?' – 'No, I've *never been* / *I never went* there.'
4. I *haven't liked* / *didn't like* grammar when I was in the third class, but I'm very interested in it now.
5. When we were small, Mother *has made* / *made* us delicious ice cream every Sunday.
6. 'Have you ever *broken* / *Did you ever break* your ankle?' – 'Yes, I *have* / *did*.' – 'When *have you done* / *did you do* it?'
