

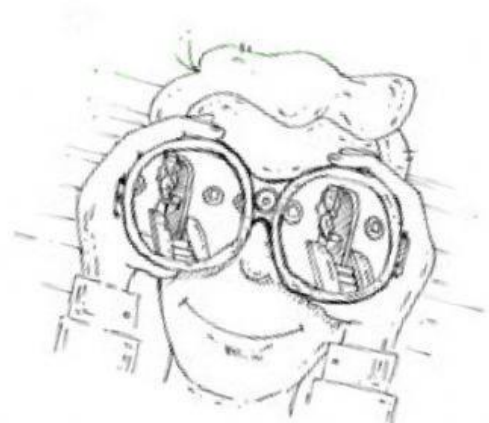
### Ćwiczenie 1.
