a) Revise the grammar rules if necessary:

- 1 so + ADJ (+ that + SENTENCE)
- 2 such (a/an) + (ADJ) + NOUN (+ SENTENCE)
- 3 too + ADJ + (for + NOUN/PRONOUN) + (to + VERB)
- 4 ADJ + enough + (for + NOUN/PRONOUN) + (to + VERB)
- 5 enough + NOUN + (for + NOUN/PRONOUN) + (to + VERB)

- 3 It's too hot to play football.
- 4 The car's hot enough to boil an egg.
- 5 There's not enough money to pay for air conditioning.
