

1 A is the remains or trace of a prehistoric plant or animal. Often the remains were covered by . Some examples of sediment are at the bottom of a lake or ocean, and , or wet dirt. Over millions of years, it becomes solid rock.



2 Over time, the remains disappear, leaving an empty in the rock. This is called a fossil. If water and get into the space, it forms a fossil.



3 Sometimes, whole animals or plants were preserved when they got stuck in different materials, such as yellow or orange from tree resin, sticky black or even ice.



4 fossils aren't the remains of animals or plants, but they do show that these living things existed. The in this picture are a good example.



5 All living things contain . Even when the other remains of a plant or animal are gone, this material persists. That is how a carbon-film fossil forms.
