3. Check the story is in other places

Look to see if the story you are reading is on other news sites that you know and trust. If you do
find it on many other sites, then it 24._____ isn't fake (although there are
some exceptions), as many big news organisations try to check their sources before they
25._____ a story.

4. Look for other signs

There are other techniques that fake news uses. These include using ALL CAPS and lots of ads
that pop up when you click on a link. Also, think about how the story makes you feel. If the
news story makes you angry, it's probably designed to make you angry.

If you know these things about online news, and can apply them in your everyday life, then you
