Ricardo Semler: a classroom revolutionary

When Ricardo Semler was 21, he was put in charge of the family firm. "I'd come from having fun in rock bands," he says, "and I'd seen that there were ways to make people (0) if they were entirely involved."

The result was one of the most (17) companies in the world, where employees choose everything from their dress code to their salaries. Critics said it would never work - yet it became one of South America's most (18) corporations and, 25 years later, Semler is applying his principles to the classroom.
