READING 1

The early 20th century was an exciting time for exploration, as adventure seekers dreamed of being the first to reach the South Pole. British naval officer and explorer Ernest Henry Shackleton first joined an expedition to the Antarctic in 1901, but his first trip ended badly; he was sent home due to illness. He tried again in 1907 and once again came home early, this time due to brutal weather conditions.

On August 1, 1914, Shackleton set off again for the South Pole aboard the ship Endurance, and by late fall the crew had reached the island of South Georgia. From there, they continued south, and in January 1915 the ship hit ice and became trapped. Shackleton and his crew made the difficult decision to abandon their ship and set up camp on the floating ice.



April 1916, Shackleton led the men in three small boats to Elephant Island, off the southern tip of Cape Horn. The island was uninhabited, and the men had little hope of getting rescued and feared the worst was yet to come.

But Shackleton refused to give up, and led a team of five out on the water again, back toward South Georgia. Sixteen days later they arrived, and Shackleton was able to organize a rescue effort and amazingly rescued the remaining crew members.

Unbelievably, not one of the 28 men died during the 497 days they were stranded.

Shackleton made one last journey, in an attempt to circumnavigate the Antarctic. Sadly, he had a heart attack and died on his ship. This brave man is known today as a key figure in the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration.
