Abaco is the second largest island of The Bahamas. Abaco is divided into two parts, Little Abaco and Great Abaco. Abaco has many small cays. The main settlements on Abaco are Hope Town and Marsh Harbour. It is famous for boat building. Boats were built there for over 200 years. Some parts of a boat are the boom, rudder, mast, and sail.

The local wood from Abaco, the Mahogany, dogwood, horseflesh and corkwood are the trees used in boat building. The felled, a corkwood tree near Hope Town is used to make the frame of the sloops. The crooks of the tree will give extra strength to the sloop. For the planking, the pineboard imported from Canada is used.

The seams will be seal with cotton before the boats are painted. Other workers make the mast, a boom, a rudder, and a sail. The sloops are almost ready for the regatta. Other types of boats are built such as the smacks, dinghies, and large cargo schooners.

Boat building is a long tradition by the Lowe family of Abaco. The Lowes learns to build boats from their grandfathers. They do other things to provide for their families.

The people of Abaco also do a lot of fishing.

Sometimes they go to sea and fish. They use net and wire pots. The Lowes like other people

on Family Islands worries that there are fewer fish in the sea nowaday. They always obey the fishing laws.

The Lowes are also farmers. Some crops that grow on Abaco are limes, oranges, and grapefruit. Vegetables also grow on the island. These are grown on a plot. The food is for their family. Any surplus is taken to the mailboat which carries it to Potters Cay in Nassau where it is sold. The money they get goes to buy fertilizer and things for the family.
