

WAS or WERE

When do we use... **WAS** or **WERE**? (x7)

We use **WAS** for something singular;
we use **WERE** for a plural.

Singular means one;
plural means more than one.

I [] , we [] , she [] , you [] , he [] ,
they [] , the king [] , the mice [] , they [] ,
my dog [] , the cats [] , my sister [] , your friends [] ,
[] , the house [] , his shoes [] , the queen [] .

We use **WERE** with **YOU**, because **YOU** can be plural or singular (X2).

You [] very cheeky, you naughty dogs. You [] amazing
my little cat. You [] all in trouble, boys and girls. You []
very beautiful your majesty.

The footballers [] , the window [] , her brothers [] ,
the carrot [] , you [] , my bag [] , the King and
queen [] , the mouse [] , my pencil [] , the chairs [] ,
[] , your drink [] , the clocks [] , an ant [] ,
the cars [] , the swimming pool [] , my thoughts [] .
