(predictions, offers, promises, intentions and decisions)

Will-& Going-to-Future



**predictions**, especially after I (don't) think....  
I think **he'll become** a lawyer.  
We use **will** for **offers and promises**  
I'll **carry** your bags.  
I **won't reveal** your secret  
**instant decisions**  
I'm thirsty. Oh, I'll **bring** you a glass of water.

**predictions**, especially when they're based on what we can see  
Look at that girl. **She's going to cry.**  
We use **going to** for **intentions**  
I'm **going to visit** my granny next weekend.
