There is	a (an)	car in the street.	There aren't any cars in the street.
There are	(two three four)	<u>cars</u> in the street.	There aren't (two) cars in the street. There are (three) cars in the street.

Is there	a	car in the street ?	Yes, there is. No, there isn't.
Are there	(two)	<u>cars</u> in the street ?	Yes, there are. No, there aren't.

There is = « there's »

There are = « there are » does not have a contraction form
