

Laughter

TO LAUGH		To laugh repeatedly in a quiet but uncontrolled way, often at something silly or rude or when you are nervous
INAPPROPRIATE		To take action, to do something, to behave
TO GIGGLE		To make the spontaneous sounds and movements of the face and body that are the instinctive expressions of amusement and sometimes also of derision.
CARTOON		not useful or suitable for a particular situation.
TO ASSUME		The action of balancing yourself upside down on your hands with your body and legs straight up in the air.
FUNNY		a simple drawing showing the features of its subjects in a humorously exaggerated way, especially a satirical one in a newspaper or magazine.
HILARIOUS		a lateral handspring with arms and legs extended
BRAIN		a ceremony or service held shortly after a person's death
HANDSTAND		extremely amusing
CARTWHEEL		The organ inside your head that controls your body's activities and enables you to think and to feel things such as heat and pain.
SMART		the way in which one acts or conducts oneself
FUNERAL		foolish, childish, or ridiculous.
TO TICKLE		causing laughter or amusement; humorous.
TO ACT		To copy what someone does or produces.
BEHAVIOUR		(of a person) clean, tidy, and well dressed / intelligent
SILLY		the use of humour, irony, exaggeration, or ridicule to expose and criticize people's stupidity or vices, particularly in the context of contemporary politics and other topical issues.
TO IMITATE		To take action, to do something, to behave
SATIRE		untrue
FAKE		to touch (a body part, a person, etc.) lightly so as to excite the surface nerves and cause uneasiness, laughter, or spasmodic movements
AUDIENCE		something (such as a knife, or gun) used to injure, defeat, or destroy
INFECTIOUS		(of a person) sensitive to being tickled.
TO SPREAD		feeling or showing hope for the future
TICKLISH		capable of transmitting infection
OPTIMISTIC		To propagate, to diffuse. / to apply on a surface
WEAPON		a group of listeners or spectators
