Subject	auxiliary	Verb	Time Phrase
I	<u>didn't</u>	<u>go</u> on holidays	last year.
You			after school.
We			yesterday.
They			in June.
He			in 1989.
She			on Monday.
It			at the weekend.

Negative Form of the Verb 'to be'

Subject	Verb	Time Phrase
You	<u>weren't</u>	last year.
We		after school.
They		yesterday.
I	<u>wasn't</u>	in June.
He		in 1989.
She		on Monday.
It		at the weekend.

Affirmative vs Negative Sentences:

Example:

She **played** tennis with her brother John on Monday. **Affirmative Sentence**

She **didn't play** tennis with her brother John on Monday. **Negative Sentence**
