

## LEARN THIS! Present Simple (Negative and interrogative form)

a- We form the present simple negative with "don't" or "doesn't" and the infinitive of the verb without to.

I **don't** play football.

She **doesn't** play football.

b- We form the present simple interrogative with "do" or "does" and the infinitive of the verb without to. We form short answers with "do / does", "don't / doesn't"

**Do** you play football? **Yes, I do. / No, I don't**

**Does** she play football? **Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't**

- 1 Ed / speak Italian?

**Does Ed speak Italian?** Yes, he does.

- 2 Emma / live in a big house?

**Does Emma live in a big house?** Yes, she does.

- 3 Ed and Emma / study biology at school?

**Do Ed and Emma study biology at school?** Yes, they do.

- 4 Emma / speak Italian?

**Does Emma speak Italian?** No, she doesn't.

- 5 Ed / live in a big house?

**Does Ed live in a big house?** No, he doesn't.

- 6 Ed and Emma / like dancing
